



LECTIO DIVINA WORKSHOP – Are You Interested?

Lectio divina is the traditional monastic art of reading the Bible in a meditative and prayerful way. In a world where there is nothing as easy as being "anxious and troubled about many things" (Lk 10:41) we tend to forget that only "one thing is needful" (Lk 10:42): an ever growing and deepening personal relationship with Jesus, The Word made flesh. To give you a chance to experience (anew) the grace of a personal relationship with God through the spiritual reading of the Scriptures, our pastoral agent Alex La Salle makes himself available in May to facilitate lectio divina workshops. He can offer either a general introduction to lectio divina or, if you've already attended this intro workshop, a lectio on one if these three biblical passages (preferably starting with the first one, because the whole thing forms a coherent whole):

- 1. Matthew 6: 7-15 (On the Our Father Prayer and the three dimensions of Christian life)
- 2. Romans 1: 1-7 (On what primarily defines a Christian)
- 3. Lk 2: 8-21 (On the foundation of discipleship)
- 4. John 3:16 (On the mission of Christ and our own)

Steps to take in order to organize a Lectio Divina workshop with Alex:

- Gather a group of at least three parishioners
- Identify 2 or 3 dates where you could meet (week days and weekends, during the day or the evening).
- Send your proposed dates to Alex (<u>affjp2@gmail.com</u>) and work with him to determine the best date to hold the workshop.
- If you are able to do so, schedule the meeting on Zoom (otherwise, Alex will do it for you).
