



St. Thérèse of Lisieux, also called St. Teresa of the Child Jesus or the Little Flower, original name Marie-Françoise-Thérèse Martin, (born January 2, 1873, Alençon, France-died September 30, 1897, Lisieux; canonized on May 17, 1925), was a Carmelite nun whose service to her Roman Catholic order, was later recognized for its exemplary spiritual accomplishments.
